

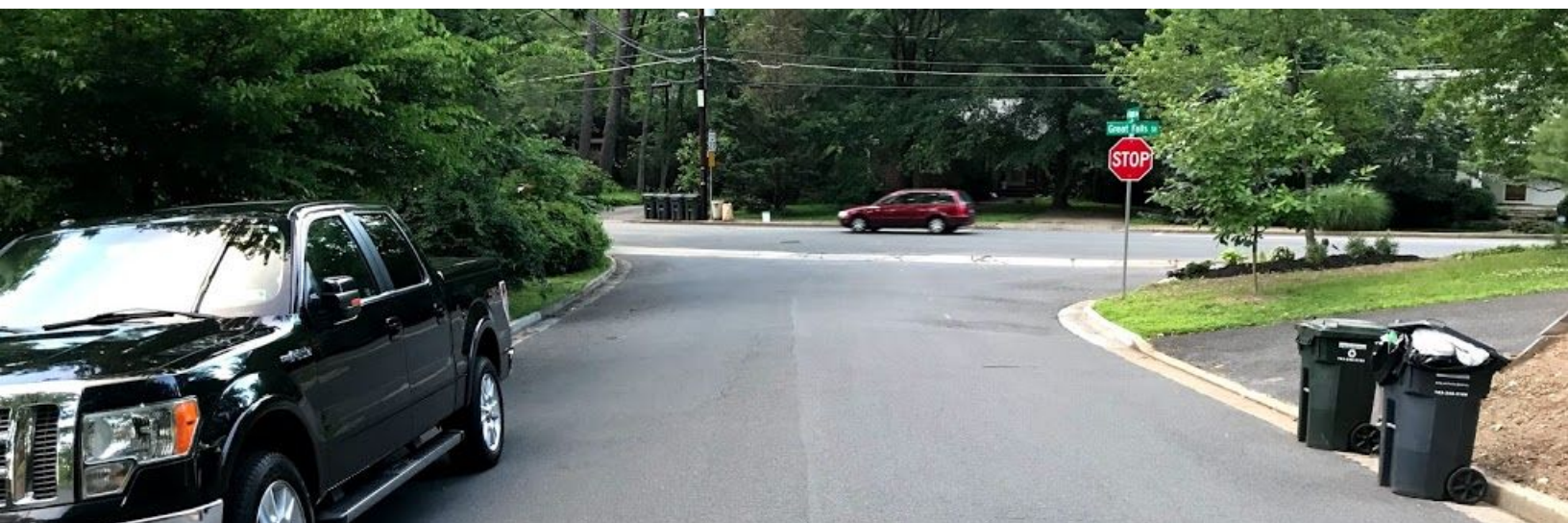

Wyatt -

This is the incredibly wide and (I believe) dangerous intersection of N. Virginia and Great Falls:



As we discussed, being so wide, cars make the right turn off of Great Falls on to N. Virginia without slowing down, which is especially dangerous since there's no sidewalk on either side of N. Virginia -- so pedestrians are forced to walk in the street.



In the long-run, I would like to see the sidewalk expanded and the crossing narrowed for pedestrians. In the short-run, I believe painting and plastic poles would be a cost- and time-efficient way to greatly improve the safety of this intersection.

There is a similar intersection just outside the city in Arlington at Washington and Little Falls Rd:



This would create a safe buffer for pedestrians walking from N. Virginia to the sidewalks along Great Falls.



Would it be possible to free up a bit of time for staff to mock-up a concept for how this approach could be implemented?
