Event Locations:

Falls Church Fall Festival and Farmer’s Market – These events take place in the parking lot areas near the Falls Church City Hall (300 Park Avenue, Falls Church 22046). Family Medicine in Falls Church and the Village Preservation and Improvement Society are cosponsoring these events with HRT and VPIS’ Neighborhood Tree Program.

Crossman Park (Adjacent to 1800 Van Buren St) - From the intersection of rt. 7 and rt. 29, head north on rt. 29. Turn right on to East Columbia Street then take a left onto Van Buren Street. Enter Park Ave. from Van Buren Street where the playground is located. You can also walk-in from North Washington Street using the Gresham Place Street parking available on Van Buren. Look for wayfinding signs.



Howard Herman Stream Valley Park – (Enter the park adjacent to 425 Rollins Street 22046) From West St. head east on Broad St. (Rt. 7). Turn right onto South Virginia Avenue then right again to stay on South Virginia Avenue. Then a right onto Rollins, the street dead-ends at the park. Follow the gravel path across the stream to our work location. You can also enter behind Oak Street Elementary School following the trail across the bridge or using the trail entrance near the Byron (Penzey’s Spice Building) off of West Broad Street. Look for wayfinding signs.
